Digital Care Hub updates

Local support is secret to Better Security, Better Care success

The independent evaluation of our programme on data protection has highlighted the crucial and expanding role of our 28 local support organisations (LSOs) across England. We already knew that - but it's great to see it formally assessed and recognised! The report indicates that, as well as exceeded our target and getting 76% of care providers complying with the Data Security and Protection Toolkit, we've brought wider benefits including support with implementing good data protection and cyber security practice. Our LSOs have really built up their skills and capacity to support care providers on a wide range of issues and attracted funding for additional programmes.

The programme has also demonstrated excellent return on investment, with an estimated £2.71 saved in terms of reduced costs and disruption caused by data breaches and cyber-attacks, for every £1 spent on the Better Security, Better Care programme.

Free elearning for data security and protection leads

Digital Care Hub launches first free eLearning programme for senior data protection leads in social care.

Building on the success of Digital Care Hub's elearning for all staff, the Hub has developed a more advanced course specifically for those with senior level responsibility for data security and protection. The training reflects real-world scenarios across care homes, supported living, home care, and community services, covering all client groups. It was developed and tested in partnership with care providers.



NHSmail Multi-Factor Authentication

77% of all social care users, managed by the National Administration Service (NAS), now have MFA enabled. On 2nd September 2024, users who had not enabled MFA were moved into a specific security group with a stronger sign-in policy.

However, with recent changes to the security landscape and after internal reviews of their effects, NHSmail needs to apply stronger measures to ensure the security of the NHS.net Connect shared tenant.

Therefore, from 26th March 2025:

- All users, including NAS managed social care users, who have not already enabled MFA, will lose access to all 365 services until MFA is applied
- Users will be prompted to enrol when they next log in to the Portal or Outlook Web/Desktop Apps, or any other 365 resource, following the change date.
- We will be communicating out to all affected accounts directly in the coming months, to alert and inform users of the change beforehand.

Data Security Protection Toolkit (DSPT)

The <u>Data Security and Protection Toolkit</u> (DSPT) helps adult social care providers in England to check and improve how they keep people's information safe. It is the official self-assessment tool for the care sector and is widely recognised by CQC, local authorities and the NHS.

Care providers must review, update and republish their toolkit assessment at least once every year, otherwise it goes out of date and it is invalid. We recommend that this is kept up to date throughout the year, especially if providers have introduced new systems or services. Providers can make changes to toolkit questions and republish at any time throughout the year. However, the toolkit does have to be published *at least* once every toolkit year. **The updated DSPT for 2024-25 is now available** – so it is a great time to complete your DSPT assessment.

Better Security, Better Care is a national and local support programme to help adult social care providers to store and share information safely. It covers paper and digital records and focuses on helping care providers to complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit – the annual, online self-assessment.

As a care provider, the programme will help you to evaluate and improve your data and cyber security. This means you can reassure the people you support and their families, your staff, commissioners, regulators, and health and care partners, that you are following good practice – and meeting legal and regulatory requirements.

You do not have to be a data or digital expert to get support. The programme can support you – wherever you are on your data security journey.

Review & republish your DSPT

Because things change, you need to review and republish your toolkit every year so that it reflects your current data and cyber security arrangements. For example, you may have introduced new staff, data systems, technology or services – which in turn will impact on how you manage your information.

This webinar is for care providers who have published before and are reviewing and republishing their DSPT. It will cover what has changed within the Toolkit for 2022/23, as well as how to:

- Login to your DSPT account
- Review your DSPT including what is different if you were previously published at Entry Level or Approaching Standards
- Complete to at least Standards Met
- Publish your DSPT standard
- Access free, official support from the Better Security, Better Care programme.

Completing the Data Security and Protection Toolkit for the first time

The Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT) is an online self-assessment tool to help adult social care providers in England to store and share information safely. It shows you what you need to do to keep people's information safe, and to protect your business from the risk of a data breach or a cyber attack. It covers both paper and digital records.

It also reassures everyone you work with that you are taking data security seriously, which in turn can open up access to NHSmail and shared records systems such as GP Connect and proxy access. Care providers must have an up-to-date DSPT in place to meet NHS contracts – and local authorities and CQC inspectors increasingly expect you to have it.

Care providers should complete the toolkit at least once a year. It will cover how to:

- Register for the DSPT including how to register if you have multiple services and sites
- Complete to Approaching Standards and Standards Met
- Publish your DSPT
- Access free, official support from the Better Security, Better Care programme.
