### **BLMK ICS Update**

Local care homes embrace technology to help manage their residents' pain

In a new video from the Digitising Social Care programme at Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes Health and Care Partnership, local care home staff explain how facial recognition app PainChek is helping them to provide better care for their residents.

PainChek recognises facial expressions and uses artificial intelligence (AI) to assess pain levels before quantifying a pain score which carers can use to inform their decision about the appropriate support. This is particularly useful for vulnerable residents who are unable to express themselves verbally, due to illness or disability.

This enables staff to take more accurate and consistent pain assessments, leading to more informed pain management decisions.

As of January 2025, more than 8,500 PainChek assessments have been completed with a total of 594 residents across 18 different care locations. Marta Kozowy, Deputy Manager and Registered Nurse at Anjulita Court Care Home in Bedford, said: "[With PainChek,] we are able to treat residents holistically. So if there is distressed behaviour, signs of infection... We can spot symptoms of pain early, implement pain relief as soon as possible, and monitor the effectiveness. We can reassure the families that the relative is comfortable, free from pain."

# **BLMK Local Support Organisation Data Security Protection Toolkit Support offer**

### Data Security Protection Toolkit (DSPT)

The <u>Data Security and Protection Toolkit</u> (DSPT) helps adult social care providers in England to check and improve how they keep people's information safe. It is the official self-assessment tool for the care sector and is widely recognised by CQC, local authorities and the NHS.

Care providers must review, update and republish their toolkit assessment at least once every year, otherwise it goes out of date and it is invalid. We recommend that this is kept up to date throughout the year, especially if providers have introduced new systems or services. Providers can make changes to toolkit questions and republish at any time throughout the year. However, the toolkit does have to be published *at least* once every toolkit year. **The updated DSPT for 2024-25 is now available** – so it is a great time to complete your DSPT assessment.

Better Security, Better Care is a national and local support programme to help adult social care providers to store and share information safely. It covers paper and digital records and focuses on helping care providers to complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit – the annual, online self-assessment.

As a care provider, the programme will help you to evaluate and improve your data and cyber security. This means you can reassure the people you support and their families, your staff, commissioners, regulators, and health and care partners, that you are following good practice – and meeting legal and regulatory requirements.

You do not have to be a data or digital expert to get support. The programme can support you – wherever you are on your data security journey.

# Review & republish your DSPT

Because things change, you need to review and republish your toolkit every year so that it reflects your current data and cyber security arrangements. For example, you may have introduced new staff, data systems, technology or services – which in turn will impact on how you manage your information.

This webinar is for care providers who have published before and are reviewing and republishing their DSPT. It will cover what has changed within the Toolkit for 2022/23, as well as how to:

- Login to your DSPT account
- Review your DSPT including what is different if you were previously published at Entry Level or Approaching Standards
- Complete to at least Standards Met
