BLMK ICS updates

Robotic pets provide comfort and companionship for local residents

With funding from NHS England, the Digitising Social Care programme at Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes Health and Care Partnership is evaluating the impact of RoboPets on adults receiving social care. Delivered in partnership with Health Innovation East and the University of Hertfordshire, the project aims to understand the acceptability, usability, cost-effectiveness and impacts as the devices are adopted in a range of settings.



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Expressions of interest were welcomed from local care home and domiciliary care providers who work with adults living with or experiencing challenging behaviour, cognitive impairment, communication difficulty or dementia. Individuals receive a robotic cat, dog or bird, and the care providers commit to working with the research team to understand how the devices are used.

RoboPets can have a positive impact on wellbeing and quality of life and support people to live independently for longer. Responding to sound and touch and interacting through realistic movements, they provide a calming influence, give people greater independence and confidence, and improve mental health and wellbeing.

As of February 2025, 484 devices have been delivered to 56 different care locations, with more scheduled to be delivered shortly. The care providers are already reporting how the RoboPets are providing company and a sense of connection, helping to reduce anxiety and encouraging social interaction.

Expressions of interest are still being accepted from care providers that meet certain criteria. The study will run until March 2026 and the findings will be published shortly afterwards. 

Data Security Protection Toolkit (DSPT)

The <u>Data Security and Protection Toolkit</u> (DSPT) helps adult social care providers in England to check and improve how they keep people's information safe. It is the official self-assessment tool for the care sector and is widely recognised by CQC, local authorities and the NHS.

Care providers must review, update and republish their toolkit assessment at least once every year, otherwise it goes out of date and it is invalid. We recommend that this is kept up to date throughout the year, especially if providers have introduced new systems or services. Providers can make changes to toolkit questions and republish at any time throughout the year. However, the toolkit does have to be published *at least* once every toolkit year. **The updated DSPT for 2024-25 is now available** – so it is a great time to complete your DSPT assessment.

Better Security, Better Care is a national and local support programme to help adult social care providers to store and share information safely. It covers paper and digital records and focuses on helping care providers to complete the Data Security and Protection Toolkit – the annual, online self-assessment.

As a care provider, the programme will help you to evaluate and improve your data and cyber security. This means you can reassure the people you support and their families, your staff, commissioners, regulators, and health and care partners, that you are following good practice – and meeting legal and regulatory requirements.

You do not have to be a data or digital expert to get support. The programme can support you – wherever you are on your data security journey.

Review & republish your DSPT

Because things change, you need to review and republish your toolkit every year so that it reflects your current data and cyber security arrangements. For example, you may have introduced new staff, data systems, technology or services – which in turn will impact on how you manage your information.

This webinar is for care providers who have published before and are reviewing and republishing their DSPT. It will cover what has changed within the Toolkit for 2022/23, as well as how to:

- Login to your DSPT account
- Review your DSPT including what is different if you were previously published at Entry Level or Approaching Standards
- Complete to at least Standards Met
- Publish your DSPT standard
- Access free, official support from the Better Security, Better Care programme.
